

ALPHA CHI OMEGA FOUNDATION MAKES IMPACT WITH RECORD-SETTING CHAPTER FUNDRAISING FOR DVA AND TRANSFORMATIONAL GRANT FOR FRATERNITY PROGRAMS

INDIANAPOLIS, September 9, 2026 — The Alpha Chi Omega Foundation is celebrating monumental impact with the close of the 2025-26 fiscal year, as grants are awarded to support Alpha Chi Omega's national philanthropy of domestic violence awareness and to sustain and grow programming for members of all ages.

HISTORIC CHAPTER FUNDRAISING FOR DVA

The Foundation celebrates Alpha Chi Omega's collegiate and alumnae chapters raising more than \$2 million for domestic violence service providers, shelters and other nonprofits in 2025-26, a record-breaking amount for a single fiscal year. This year's efforts bring the total amount raised through the Foundation's Community Impact program to \$15.7 million.

The Community Impact program, launched in 2004, provides fundraising tools and assistance to collegiate and alumnae chapters for their philanthropic events. Chapters receive Foundation recognition for every dollar raised during their Community Impact events, and the Foundation grants the proceeds to local charities on behalf of the chapters. Chapters host events that engage their campuses and communities, including awareness walks, sports tournaments and carnation sales, and education is provided on recognizing domestic violence, preventing sexual assault and learning how to have healthy relationships.

"I'm proud of our members' hard work to raise these funds to end domestic violence and support victims and survivors across the country," said Maree Lattanzi, Foundation chair. "The grants the Foundation made this year to service providers and shelters will have a lasting impact in the local communities our members call home."

Domestic violence is a global issue with local impact. As part of this historic milestone, 158 organizations across the country were recipients of the proceeds from 406 Community Impact events held by 134 chapters last year. These local charities provide

emergency shelter, legal support, mental health services and education about domestic violence to survivors and their communities at large. The Foundation is honored to support their work and the efforts of our collegiate and alumnae chapters.

TRANSFORMATIONAL GRANT FOR FRATERNITY PROGRAMMING

After a successful fundraising year, the Foundation Board of Trustees approved additional funds to bring the total of the Fraternity Grant to \$1 million for 2026-27. The highest grant amount in several years, the Fraternity Grant will be used to sustain and grow educational and leadership programming.

The Fraternity Grant funds programming and training that are part of the Real. Strong. Women. Experience, helping collegiate and alumnae members reach their full potential. This includes signature programs like Leadership Academy and Collegiate Growth Academy, as well as harm reduction programming, domestic violence awareness initiatives and many more opportunities for members of all ages.

“Thanks to the generosity of our donors, the Board of Trustees could approve these funds to make a transformational impact on the lives of our sisters,” Maree said. “Alpha Chi Omega’s best-in-class programming delivers on the promise made to each member when she joins to help her live and grow as a real, strong woman.”
